Roy Dean Mason, 76, of Kingman, IN (formerly of Manteno, IL), passed away Saturday, October 27, 2018 peacefully at the Gibson Family Center for Hospice Care/ Union Hospital in Terre Haute, IN.

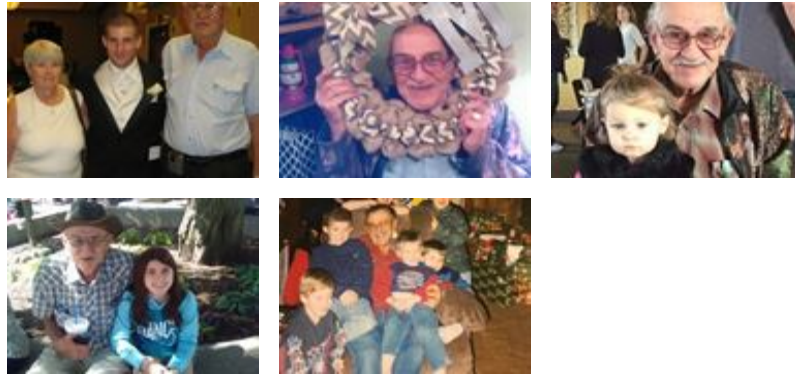
